Source A A painting entitled 'The Harvest of Battle', by the British artist, CWR Nevinson, 1919.

It was painted as part of a record of the First World War. Nevinson based his painting on sketches made during a visit to the Western Front in 1917.



Source B Adapted from a speech by the German Kaiser, Wilhelm II, to young sailors in 1901.
